Cub Scout Adventure Camp 2021

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Arrival:

- No Friday night camping
- Check-in is from 8-9am Saturday
- At the check-in station (just past the front gates) you will be given a parking pass and proceed to our assigned campsite pavilion. We are in sites 17 and 18, off of ROAD B. The site list is located at the bottom of this document.
- If you arrive after 9am, you must proceed to the Headquarters building to receive your parking pass.

Check-in:

- When you park at your assigned campsite, please wait in your car. A staff member will greet you. Please wear your masks and have your Covid questionnaires ready for everyone in the vehicle. The staff member will also be taking the temperature of everyone in the vehicle. **YOU MUST PRINT, FILL OUT AND PRESENT THE COVID QUESTIONNAIRE TO THE STAFF MEMBER.** The questionnaire is on page 6.
- After check-in, you will proceed to the pavilion to turn in any outstanding medical forms and check to make sure there are no changes to the schedule.
- We will begin walking to our first rotation at 9:15am, with a start time of 9:30am.

Meals:

- If you indicated that you would need a vegetarian option, please pick up a wrist band when you check-in.
- Lunch – you will pick up lunch from the Dining Hall at 11:45am and take it back to your campsite to eat.
- Dinner will be in the dining hall. Our dinner time is at 5:00pm.
 - See page 10 for seating arrangements, as tables are reserved for our Pack. Please note the arrow paths you must follow to the tables, and that Scouts will sweep and clean before exiting the dining hall. We must exit by 5:45.
- Breakfast Sunday – is grab and go from 8am-8:45am.

Water, Restrooms, and Showers:

- Water pump faucets are available in the campsites.
- Water to refill water bottles and hand washing stations will be provided at each pavilion and program session area.
- The bathhouses in the campsites are not functional due to damage from the winter storm. The dining hall, kitchen, and headquarters buildings are fully functional.
- Fresh portable restrooms will be available in the campsites and program stations.

Program Rotations:

- Please see page 9 for a copy of our schedule. If there are changes, we will have an updated schedule posted at the campsite pavilions.

Campfire Program and Rank Advancement Ceremony:

- The Rank Advancement Ceremony will begin at 7pm on Saturday night.
- Directly following we will have our traditional campfire program with skits, songs and s'mores. S'more kits will be provided by the Pack. We will have enough for everyone in camp.
- Quiet time starts at 10pm.

Check-out:

- If you are leaving Saturday night, please check-out at the Health Lodge before you exit the property.
- Scotus will perform a "police line" after everyone has packed up to ensure a clean campsite.
- We are responsible for removing all trash and debris. Please clean up after yourself for a quick check-out on Sunday.
- Everyone must have exited the property by 11am.

What to bring:

- Everyone should bring their own masks and be prepared to always wear them.
- Comfortable CLOSED TOED shoes.
- A personal refillable water bottle for each person.
- Sunscreen or sun protective clothing.
- Layered clothing for cool mornings and warm afternoon.
- Camp chairs and wagon for transportation between rotations.
- Flashlights and/or headlamps.
- IF YOU HAVE NOT SUBMITTED MEDICAL FORMS, YOU MUST BRING THEM TO CAMP.

What not to bring:

- Pets
- Skates, roller blades, skateboards and scooters.
- No one is allowed to ride in the back of trucks or trailers.
- Do not drive from campsites to program areas or the dining hall.
- Alcohol and tobacco products
- Lighter fluid

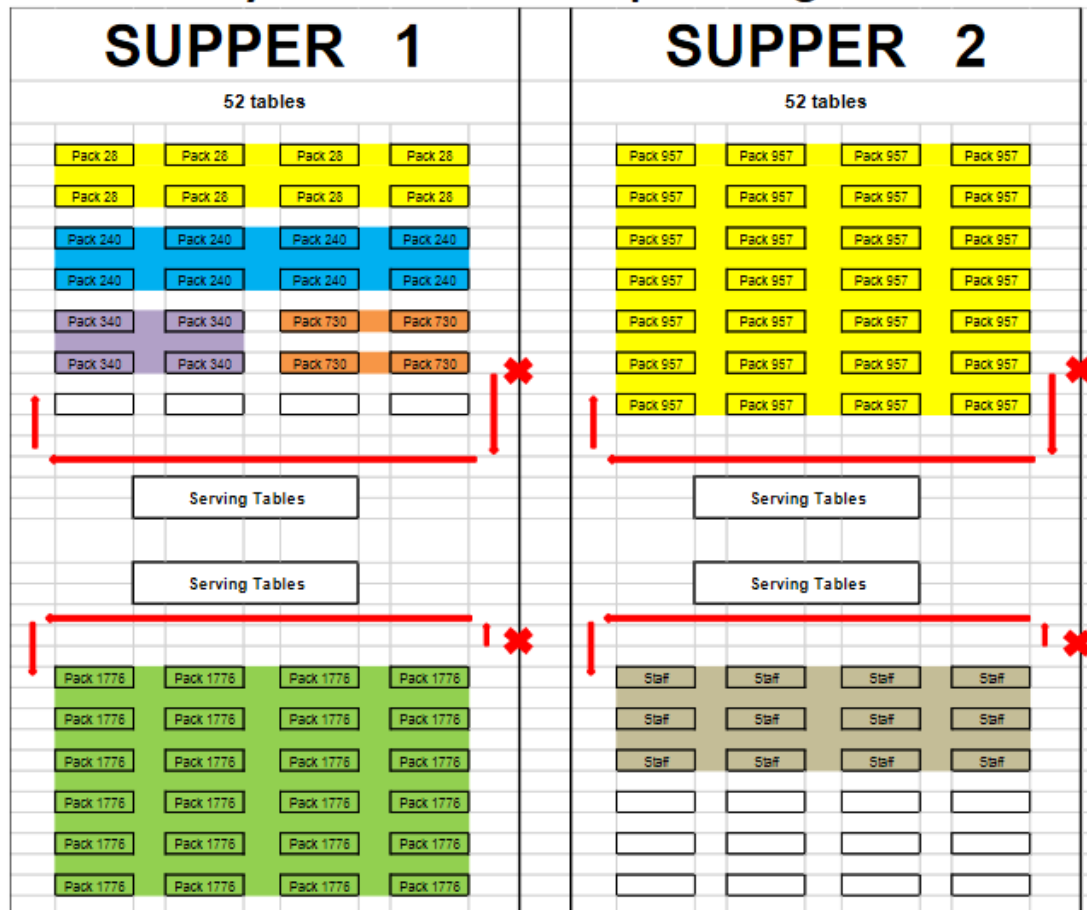
Check in 8 am – 9 am at Campsites

Everyone must check in and go through the temp check and turn in forms.

Anyone arriving after 9 am must come directly to the Headquarters to get a temp check and turn in forms then go to their campsite.

This is mandatory.

Campers line up at the doors marked by **X** facing the flag pavilion.

We will have grace outside and then open the doors.

Go through the serving lines following arrow paths to your assigned table areas, seat practicing distancing.

- Sweep up debris under tables and clean up spills
- Leave chairs down
- Staff will wipe down tables
- Supper 1, please be out by 5:45 so staff can prep hall for next rotation.

COVID-19 “At-Risk” Camp Participant Statement

Your safety and the safety of all our members, volunteers, and employees is the Sam Houston Area Council’s top priority. While there is still much uncertainty regarding COVID-19, we are monitoring the information provided by health experts and government agencies to help keep safe those who choose to come to camp this summer.

Our mitigation plan includes:

- Pre-attendance education,
- Health screening conducted by your family prior to travel to our camp, including a temperature check.
- Health screening upon your arrival at camp conducted by our camp health officers, which will also include a temperature check.
- Anyone displaying symptoms of COVID-19 will be not be allowed to stay at camp. They will be sent home.
- Limitations on visitors in camp.
 - Visitors are limited to dropping off and picking up Scouts.
- Scouts who begin to display symptoms of COVID-19 during the day will be separated from the rest of the class. A parent/unit leader will be notified and must come up to camp to pick the Scout up.
- Hygiene reminders while at camp.
- Handwashing /sanitizer stations throughout camp.
- Cleaning and disinfecting high-touch surfaces and shared program equipment.

These precautions are important, but these efforts cannot eliminate the potential for exposure to COVID-19 or any other illness while at camp. Experts have said that people with COVID-19 may show no signs or symptoms of illness, but can still spread the virus, and people may be contagious before their symptoms occur. The fact is, that someone with COVID-19 may pass the required health screenings and be allowed into camp.

We also know the very nature of camp makes social distancing difficult in many situations and impossible in others.

Information from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) states that older adults and people of any age who have serious underlying medical conditions are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19. *If you are in this group, please ensure you have approval from your health care provider prior to attending camp.*

Every staff member, volunteer, and Scouting family has to evaluate their unique circumstances and make an informed decision before attending camp. We hope this information will be helpful as you make that choice.
