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Pack Leadership & Committees

What is a Pack? The Pack is designated as the collective unit of adult volunteers, scouts and parents. Each Pack consists of Dens, which are smaller groups of scouts based on their grade level and gender. Boys will be in a den with other boys, and girls will be in a den with other girls.

Lion = Kindergarten, Tiger = 1st Grade, Wolf= 2nd Grade, Bear = 3rd Grade, Webelos = 4th Grade, and Arrow of Light = 5th Grade.

Den Leaders (and Assistant Den Leaders) play a special role in the Den. These adult volunteers are instrumental in the advancement of their den. If you are looking for a rewarding experience, and an opportunity to create lifelong memories with your scout, please consider volunteering.

The Pack Leadership Team is defined as Committee Chair, Cubmaster, and Assistant Cubmaster (if applicable), Treasurer, and Secretary. Other positions recognized as key roles are those such as Den Leaders, Treasurer, and Advancement Coordinator.

We need your help!! Without volunteerism, our Pack wouldn't function. If you would like to help make a difference, consider helping out with a committee. Whether you have a lot of time, or just a little, there is something for everyone. Examples include: Outdoor Committee, Special Events Committee, Blue & Gold Committee, Fundraising Committee, etc.

Uniforms

All Scouts will need an Official BSA Uniform (Class A). These are to be worn at Pack Meetings, and at other formal scouting events. The Pack tee-shirt (Class B) is worn while at camp and other outdoor activities. Uniforms can be purchased locally at Scout Stops, or online at www.scoutshop.org. Our Pack only requires from belt up (no pants or socks): belt, shirt, neckerchief, slide, and hat. The uniform for Lions is the Lion teeshirt, hat and belt. If you need affordable solutions to the cost of the uniform, please ask any member of the leadership team for help.

Advancement Tracking

Achievements toward rank will be tracked using Scoutbook. Only Den Leaders are able to record the achievement progress for scouts. If parents work on achievements at home, they are responsible for communicating with their Den Leader for tracking purposes. Should any disagreements arise, the Advancement Coordinator will work with Den Leaders and Pack Leadership to resolve the issue. Parents are encouraged to create an account and follow along in your Scout's journey.

Awards and Recognitions

As Scouts journey toward their rank, they will have many achievements along the way. Belt Loops/pins are used as recognition along the way. Our Advancement Coordinator works with Den Leaders to ensure your Scout is being recognized at Pack Meetings. Our advancement ceremony is typically at our spring campout. Please be aware, that a Scout must attend a minimum of 51% of their den meetings to be eligible for advancement.

Registration and Dues

Registration fees for Lion, Tiger, Wolf, Bear and Webelos Scouts is \$100 for the scouting year. Fees for Arrow of Light Scouts are \$65. Your assistance with fundraising supplements the funding we require to run a successful scouting unit.

What does registration include? Nearly everything. We do our best to make sure your Scout is fully covered by their registration – including a free Pack tee shirt (Class B Uniform). Also included is: pinewood derby car, rocket engines, all achievement awards, special events, activity fees, Pack dues to the BSA, , etc.

Some additional fees may be incurred by the adult leader (and/or siblings) accompanying your Scout. However, the cost of those activities is always done at cost to save our families money.

Fundraising

Fundraising is critical to the success of the whole Pack. Registration dues only cover half of our programming budget and we rely on fundraising to cover the remaining costs. We ask that families commit to either fundraising at least \$300 per Scout, or pay the \$100 opt-out to not fundraise.

Our most successful fundraiser is Popcorn Sales, which is done in the fall.

Cub Bucks

Cub Bucks are used as part of a reward program, and are earned throughout the year. Scouts can be awarded by any member of the leadership team, and for a variety of reasons. Den Leaders are also given cub bucks to hand out during your den meetings too. Scouts will redeem their Cub Bucks for prizes at our End of Year Auction.

Fundraising and participating in scouting events is another great way to earn extra Cub Bucks!

Cub Buck Awards:

Fundraising: Popcorn and Coupon Books

- Scouts will earn double the Cub Bucks for each dollar earned in fundraising.
 - Ex: \$400 in fundraising sales earns \$800 in Cub Bucks.
- Top fundraiser in each Den (for each fundraiser) will receive a bonus of \$500 Cub Bucks
- Top fundraiser in the Pack (for each fundraiser) will receive a \$1000 bonus

Additional prizes and/or awards may be given. Those will be announced at the Pack meetings.

Parental Involvement

Cub Scouting is very family oriented, and parents are encouraged to participate in both Den and Pack activities. Whether it's helping in your Den, or helping with the Pack, we are all responsible for helping the Pack grow. Volunteerism and service to others are important values in scouting, and your Scout looks to you for those examples. Pack leadership and Den Leaders already do so much for our Scouts, please consider a small amount of time to help out.

Also note that Lion and Tiger Scouts are required to have an adult partner with them at all times.

Youth Protection Training

Youth Protection Training (YPT) is required for all adult leaders, and any adults that attend a council sponsored camping event. BSA requires "two deep leadership" at all times. This means that a minimum of two registered adult leaders, or one registered leader and a participating Scout's parent, or another adult is required for all trips and outings. It also requires that **one-on-one contact between adults and youth members is prohibited.**
